Tenure-Track Professor of Historical and Systematic Theology

The School of Theology and Religious Studies at The Catholic University of America invites applications for a full-time, open-rank, tenure-track faculty position in historical and systematic theology, to begin Fall 2019. The school encourages applications from scholars of all ranks who either already have, or give promise of having, a distinguished record of research and publication and of teaching excellence at the undergraduate and graduate levels. The successful applicant will possess broad expertise in historical and systematic theology in a range of historical periods. Strong familiarity with modern and contemporary theology in multiple languages, especially German, is required. Expertise in Christology, Trinity, and philosophical theology is desired.

Besides teaching undergraduates, graduates, and seminarians, the successful candidate will be expected to advise students, direct research, serve on committees, and in general contribute in a collegial fashion to the work of the School of Theology and Religious Studies. Rank and salary will be determined on the basis of experience, academic credentials, and publication record.
