Tenure-Track Professor of American Church History (Open Rank – rank to be determined)

The School of Theology and Religious Studies at The Catholic University of America seeks to fill a full-time, rank open, tenure-track position in American Church History to begin in August 2019. The school encourages applications from scholars of all ranks who either already have, or give promise of having, a distinguished record of research and publication and of teaching excellence. The successful candidate, who possesses a S.T.D. or Ph.D., will continue the tradition of scholarship in the field begun at this University by Peter Guilday and John Tracy Ellis that unites church history with theological understanding. The person who fills the position will be expected to teach undergraduate, seminary, and graduate/doctoral students in the University, advise students, direct master's theses and doctoral dissertations, and serve on committees. Rank and salary will be determined on the basis of academic credentials and publication record.

We seek candidates who understand, are enthusiastic about, and will make a significant contribution to the mission of the University, which reads as follows: "As the national university of the Catholic Church in the United States, founded and sponsored by the bishops of the country with approval of the Holy See, The Catholic University of America is committed to being a comprehensive Catholic and American institution of higher learning, faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ as handed on to the Church.
