Tenure-Track Professor of Canon Law**

The School of Canon Law at The Catholic University of America invites applications for a full-time, open-rank, tenure-track faculty position in canon law, to begin Spring 2020. The school encourages applications from scholars of all ranks who either already have, or give promise of having, a distinguished record of research and publication and of teaching excellence at the graduate level.

The successful applicant will possess broad expertise in the discipline of canon law. This will include several years of canonical practice and familiarity with historical and contemporary canonical studies with research proficiency in multiple languages, especially Latin and Italian. The successful candidate will advise students, direct research, serve on committees, and in general contribute in a collegial fashion to the work of the School of Canon Law. Rank and salary will be determined on the basis of experience, academic credentials, and publication record.

The candidate must be a practicing Catholic and in good standing with the Church.

To apply, please send to the confidential attention of the Dean of the School of Canon Law, (1) a curriculum vitae and (2) the names of three referees. Applicants who are clerics or religious must also request that their superior send directly to the Dean of the School an (3) original letter stating that the applicant has permission to apply for the position and that he or she is in good standing with the diocese or institute.
