



**Busch School of Business
Assistant Professor of Finance**

The Busch School of Business at The Catholic University of America seeks to fill a full-time position as Assistant Professor of Finance, to begin in January or August 2020.

The national university of the Catholic Church, The Catholic University of America is a national research university with 6,000 undergraduate and graduate students in more than 180 academic programs on a residential campus in the heart of the nation's capital. The Tim and Steph Busch School of Business, founded in 2013 and housed in Maloney Hall, a beautiful century-old collegiate gothic building reopened in early 2019 after a \$37 million renovation, is committed to the application of Catholic Social Doctrine to business through thought leadership and formation of our students as virtuous Catholic business leaders.

We seek candidates who understand, are enthusiastic about, and will make a significant contribution to the mission of the University, which reads as follows: "As the national university of the Catholic Church in the United States, founded and sponsored by the bishops of the country with the approval of the Holy See, The Catholic University of America is committed to being a comprehensive Catholic and American institution of higher learning, faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ as handed on by the Church. The position is a tenure track appointment at the rank of assistant professor. Candidates at other ranks, or professional track, will also be considered. Responsibilities include research (for tenure-track candidates), teaching, and mentoring students, both undergraduate and graduate. The successful candidate will have a strong commitment to excellence in teaching and (for tenure-track candidates) will be expected to build a strong research program that will enhance the current programs at the Busch School. Applicants must have, at a minimum of a Master's degree in finance or related field, but a Ph.D. is preferred. For fullest consideration, applications should be received by October 1, 2019.
