Candidates must possess a J.D. or equivalent, superior academic credentials, and relevant professional experience such as teaching, legal practice, or judicial clerkships.

The application should include a letter of interest, CV, names that may be contacted to provide letters of recommendation, sample publications, as well as a personal statement.
